Real Resolve

Even before having children, Danny and I both worked many nights and weekends in ministry. Often times we seemed to be saying to each other, "you did NOT tell me about that meeting." So, a resolution we made early in our marriage (after maybe an argument or two... or fifty-seven), was to put our commitments in a SHARED Google calendar.

As we begin a new year, I think many of us find ourselves looking at those "sore spots" in our lives and try to figure out how to "make them better." Maybe it's changing an exercise program, meal planning, proactively studying, implementing better time management practices, or any number of things that, when that calendar flips to January, we want to change to do things the "right" way or do them better than before. I have even fallen into that trap some years!

I think one of the beauties of our faith is that we are always called to deepen our faith life and our relationship with Jesus. We are always a work in progress, and we are always on a journey with God. Luckily God is not bound to a calendar year or fresh Januarys. God is always calling us to transformation. There are times in the Church liturgical year that just naturally lend themselves to that transformation such as Advent and Lent. However, no matter the time or the season or what resolves you make or don't make, God is seeking a relationship with each of us during each new year.

In early December, Alter students had the opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation during our All-School Reconciliation Services held during Theology classes. Six wonderful priests - Fr. Dan Meyer, Fr. Chibueze Asiegbulem, Fr. Tom Nevels, Fr. Tim Fahey, Fr. Brian Phelps, and Fr. Ignatius Madanu - gave their time to come and hear confessions. One of the things I emphasized to the students, which I think resonates each new year, is that Reconciliation is an opportunity to improve our relationship with Jesus. Often, I notice students begin to feel anxious or apprehensive about going to Reconciliation, but the Sacrament is truly to help us grow closer to God by helping us identify those things that stand in the way of our relationship with God. Perhaps instead of a running list of "things to do better" or "ways to improve," we can keep it simpler this year. We can resolve to improve our relationship with God each day. Maybe as we work on growing our relationship with the Lord, it will lead us to the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Maybe it will lead us to reconciliation with a family member or friend. Instead of identifying just the "sore spots" (like my family calendar), we can ask ourselves daily - how can I know, love, and serve the Lord better today?


