Dear Families:

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the Lenten season, a time of self-examination, reflection, repentance and preparation. In past Lenten seasons, Pope Francis has asked us to commit to three goals during this time:

- **1.** To accept God's invitation to build a closer relationship with Him.
- 2. To remember the importance of prayer as a means of responding to God's love.
- **3.** To commit to building a better world in Jesus' name.

Three beautiful requests, but how do we comply? How do we do this? And how does this look every day in our school and in our community? I challenge us all to try the following for Lent:

- **1.** In order to build a closer relationship with God, let's give up gossip. Instead of indulging in negative talk, let's say something positive or not say anything at all.
- **2**. As a means of responding to God's love, let's give up negativity, complaining, and criticism that only bring us down as well as those around us.
- **3.** To commit to building a better world, let's be encouragers this Lenten season and seek out one person every day and encourage them in some way. This doesn't have to be complicated it can be as simple as a smile or a hello. You can email, text, or snap someone to let them know you are thinking of them. Imagine this, if you encourage just one person a day, by the end of Lent, then you will have encouraged 40 people in some way (46 if you do this on Sundays, too).

Know that I am praying for you and your intentions during the Lenten season as well, please don't hesitate to reach out to me if you would like for me to pray for you in a special way. As I always tell the students, all prayer requests are always confidential.

May God lead us and guide us through the Lenten season, and may we discover that we are closer to Him and to one another on Easter morning.

Opportunities for Growth!

March ushers in an important season for all members of our family - baseball! My three boys and Danny follow baseball, play baseball, coach baseball, and of course, always hold out hope that maybe the Reds will be better this year. While I did not grow up in a baseball-loving home, I now have a soft spot and admiration for what Danny reminds us frequently of, that baseball is "the game of failure."

Baseball is given that reference because even the best players fail more often than they succeed. Statistical failures occur in many aspects of the game, but especially hitting. Many major league players get a hit about one out of four times and fail to get a hit three times, giving them a .250 batting average. When my boys are bummed about striking out during a game, Danny quickly pulls out those fun math statistics.

It's fitting that baseball season begins during Lent because I hear from many people about how they "failed" Lent. Maybe you didn't get up early to pray each day, or accidentally ate a Cheeseburger on a Friday, or ate chocolate when you'd "given it up." Maybe you think you've failed because you haven't started Lent yet. After missing a day or perhaps eating a cookie, a lot of people throw their hands up and say "I already messed up, might as well just quit that Lenten goal - I failed!"

The beauty of our faith reminds us that, try as we might, we actually can't "fail" Lent. Lent is a season on our faith journey that is supposed to help us grow closer to Jesus. My relationship with God has never been linear. There are ups and downs, twists and turns, and sometimes things that feel like failures were some of the most profound ways that I came to know God.

Like the batter that steps into the box several times each game, we are called during Lent to keep coming back to Jesus despite setbacks or failures. God's mercies are new each day. There's no way to truly fail Lent if we keep coming back to God.

Alter provides a number of ways to start or help continue our students' journey through Lent. In March, Mass is offered twice in the Chapel before school (3/3 & 3/31) and at an All School Mass (3/15), and Lenten Reconciliation Services are held (3/29). Sophomores participate in a retreat (3/16) and juniors participate in our first Kairos retreat (3/21-24). Each of these faith opportunities offer us moments to pause and reflect in our busy Lenten season. Instead of looking at Lent as a time of failure, what if we saw Lent as a time of growth? How can the "failures" and mistakes along the way help us to grow?


