While many around us will be celebrating with chocolate, hearts, and flowers, on February 14th, we as Catholics mark the beginning of the penitential season of Lent. Aka: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving! And while the red hearts of Valentine's Day and the purple of Lent may seem to clash, I think these two days together can teach us a lot about who God is.

Hello from the Technology Team! It's hard to believe the months are flying by so fast and its already February, the month of love. This brings to mind the need to express love not only to others, but also to our Technology! Let's look at some ways you can "Love Your Technology".

Loving your technology is all about making sure you are caring for it, like you would care for a pet. There is a need to make sure we keep our technology clean from foreign substances and debris. You can do this by using an approved wet wipe to clean your screen and then using the same wipe, clean off your keyboard and touch pad. 
Baseball


Hockey


Girls' Basketball
